2-1-1 Arizona is a trusted and essential resource for Arizona residents.

Since 2011, 2-1-1 Arizona has been the state-recognized human services information referral resource. 2-1-1 is the most common-sense partner to put Arizonans on the path to self-sufficiency, promote evidence-based and cost-effective services, bolster Arizona philanthropy and analyze trends in critical community needs.

While an average 2-1-1 calls last only minutes, the return on investment is high: 85% of people contacting 2-1-1 were provided referrals and 78% reported improvement on their path to self-sufficiency.

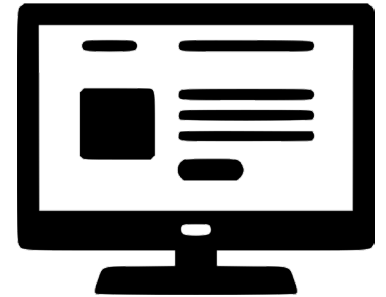
