



Legal Help in Arizona

Arizona residents can seek free or low-cost help to assist them with their legal needs. There are various agencies in Arizona available to provide legal assistance. To navigate available legal services, individuals can utilize Arizona Law Help to be referred to a legal agency near them.

What is Arizona Law Help?

Arizona Law Help collaborates with community agencies around Arizona including Community Legal Services, DNA People's Legal Services, and Southern Arizona Legal Aid, Inc., to connect qualifying individuals to free or reduced-fee legal help.

How do I know if I qualify for free or low-cost legal help?

To determine your eligibility for free or low-cost legal help, you can complete a 5-minute screening online or via phone through Arizona Law Help. You will then be referred to a free or low-cost legal agency near you.

- Complete an over the phone screening to check your eligibility for free or reduced fee legal help by calling 866-637-5341.
- Complete an online screening by visiting azlawhelp.org.

What type of legal help is available to me?

While each legal agency offers a variety of services, you may qualify to receive legal help to address landlord/tenant issues, eviction prevention, foreclosure, unemployment benefits, and filing court cases.

Is there a legal agency near me that provides free legal help?

Yes, the following agencies provide free legal help to qualifying individuals.

- **Community Legal Services**
 - Serves La Paz, Maricopa, Mohave, Yavapai, and Yuma Counties.
